

HISTORY


The National Service Scheme (NSS) was established in India on September 24, 1969, to commemorate the birth centenary of Mahatma Gandhi.

The idea behind NSS was to involve students in the task of national service, thereby fostering a sense of social responsibility and community engagement.

The scheme was launched under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

The origins of NSS can be traced back to the recommendations of the Education Commission (1964-66), headed by Dr. D.S. Kothari, which suggested that students should engage in some form of social service.

The scheme was initially introduced in 37 universities, involving 40,000 students.



Over the years, NSS has expanded significantly and now includes millions of student volunteers from various educational institutions across the country.

At present there over 37 Lakh volunteers enrolled in NSS from all regions of the country


NSS - MOTO

As members of the NSS unit at Rayat College of Law, we are committed to embodying this philosophy and making a tangible difference in our community.




NSS LOGO

The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit.


The eight bars represent the 24 hours of day, hence it reflects the wearer to be in readiness for service around the clock.

The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind





NSS at RCL




FROM THE PROGRAM OFFICER'S DESK....






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
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TREE PLANTATION AND ENLIGHTENING LECTURE


May 6 to 8, 2024





Overall, the workshop served its purpose of familiarizing NSS volunteers with the MYBharat portal and empowering them to leverage its resources for their growth and advancement.

3-DAY AWARENESS CAMP






The three day camp included several activities like - tree plantation , videography & photography competitions , poster making competitions and many other activities.


PLASTIC FREE DAY

A lecture on the rigorous use of plastic and why it should not be used was also delivered.


The highlight of the event was a skit performed by two talented volunteers , which vividly depicted the adverse effects of plastic on daily life.





The principal of the Government Senior Secondary School commended the NSS Unit for organizing such a valuable and impactful event, expressing best wishes for future initiatives.




September 10, 2024

This programme was also conducted to enroll new and aspiring students in the nss unit of the college.





VIRTUAL WORKSHOP ON MYBHARAT PORTAL






Approximately 60 NSS volunteers participated in the session.




CLEANLINESS DRIVE AT INDUS VALLEY CIVILIZATION SITE




PREAMBLE


November 27, 2024




November 30, 2024

7 DAYS NSS CAMP


February 6 - 12 , 2025


DAY 1: INAUGURATION & ORIENTATION






A quiz competition on environmental awareness further engaged the volunteers, who also received caps and stationery kits. Faculty members actively participated, setting the tone for an impactful week.


DAY 2: CLEANLINESS DRIVE & 2024-2025 DIGITAL LITERACY AWARENESS






February 8, 2025

A declamation competition tested the oratory skills of students on socially relevant topics. Volunteers again came together to prepare and share lunch, building camaraderie.




The evening featured Ann Seva, where food was distributed to children, followed by rehearsals for a street play. The day ended with a planning session, solidifying the spirit of service and learning

DAY 4: CYBER SECURITY AWAWARENESS RALLY



The NSS unit also visited a gurudwara to embrace spirituality.




February 10, 2025




The planning session for the next day further fueled their enthusiasm for community service.


February 11, 2025


Creative competitions such as "Best Out of Waste" and a "Constitutional Law Quiz" showcased the volunteers' talents.

February 12 , 2025


